



#### 2024 Giveaway

2024 was a remarkable year for our school materials program. We grew from 373 in 2023 to 895 students totaling 46,625 individual material units including all the basics like notebooks, crayons, pencils, rulers, etc.

#### 2024 Uganda Giveaway

In February, we distributed school materials to 605 students across Western, Central, and Eastern Uganda. Our original schools—Shalom Primary, Trey Jr. School, and the NMF Orphanage received materials in Central Uganda. In Eastern Uganda, our partner orphanage, the Empathy Children Initiative, and an additional 300 students from Lukungu Primary, Mbirabira Primary, and Luwerere Primary also benefited from the distribution. The remaining materials were provided to a new NGO partner in Western Uganda, who distributed them to students at his service community.

#### 2024 Peru Giveaway

In March, we distributed school materials to 290 students across nine of our partner schools and one orphanage. This year, we were honored to expand our contributions to additional schools and to begin a meaningful partnership with Casa del Buen Trato Hovde, an orphanage and safe house. This incredible home shelters 24 resilient girls recovering from unimaginable trauma, and we are grateful to support their journey.

#### **April Gum Boots**

A generous donation from our friend Troy Ray and family at Ray 5 Farms in Carthage, AR, arrived just in time for the rainy season in Wakiso, Uganda. Thanks to the Ray family, we were able to purchase **rain boots**, or "Gum Boots," for 209 children at Trey Jr. School.

The Ray family has been a strong supporter of Trey Jr. School since its inception. Their ongoing commitment enabled us to bring 20 children out of child labor and into the classroom when we opened the school. With their support, the school has flourished beyond our dreams, becoming a beacon of hope and opportunity in the community.












#### April - When Disaster hits, we act!

Two weeks after delivering school supplies to our children at IEI 583 Initial School of Yanayacu, the school was severely damaged by a river flood. Unusually strong rains in the area caused the river to overflow, devastating all buildings and homes along its banks. Yanayacu, a small community, is located right on the riverbank, and unfortunately, all the materials we had provided were destroyed by the flood.

This became our first opportunity to support the community in the aftermath of a disaster. With the help of our dedicated coordinator, **Esmeralda Tarazona**, we acted quickly to purchase a new set of school supplies and made them available for immediate use, ensuring the children could continue their education without delay.




#### **All Materials Purchased for 2025**

### EDUCATION - SCHOOL MATERIALS OUR 2024 SCHOOLS



Formally known as Casa del Buen Trato Hovde, this remarkable safe house provides refuge and care for 24 resilient girls who have been rescued from unimaginable abuse. At **Casa Hovde**, each girl receives comprehensive treatment, counseling, education, and unconditional love.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), **one in five** women and one in seven men report having been sexually abused as children. The consequences of child maltreatment can include lifelong physical and mental health challenges, as well as social and occupational impacts that may hinder a country's economic and social development.

At Casa Hovde, **every girl benefits** from a dedicated team of professionals committed to their well-being, protection, growth, and education.

Dear Future has been honored to partner with Casa Hovde since 2023. As proud supporters of the girls' education and welfare, we have provided school materials, panetones, postcards and holiday gifts to bring joy and comfort to their lives. Looking ahead, we aspire to deepen our collaboration through workshops and an even closer relationship to support these incredible girls on their journey to healing and empowerment.



# WE CHANGED OUR APPROACH

#### Our Commitment to Sustainability and Cost Effectiveness

In January 2024, we committed to transitioning from disposable to reusable menstrual products for girls in East Africa, focusing on sustainability and long-term impact. Disposable pads requires frequent restocking and generates significant waste, while reusable pads provide a longer service life and reduce environmental impact.

In May 2024, our Board of Directors approved this transition, selecting AFRIpads, a trusted Ugandan supplier, as our partner. Each AFRIpads pack offers a minimum of 24 months of use, reduces waste, and avoids potential allergic reactions.

Since then, we've made two bulk purchases and partnered with local organizations for distribution and education. Our team, trained by AFRIpads, teaches recipients proper use, cleaning, and storage while addressing critical topics like underage marriage, sexual health, and adolescence. This initiative empowers girls with knowledge and tools to thrive.






#### Knowing What Counts

In 2024, we committed to a significant shift, focusing on meaningful improvements and redefining how we measure success. Real success, for us, lies in understanding what truly counts: the impact we make on each individual girl's life.

By transitioning to reusable **AFRIpads**, we recognized that while we might distribute fewer individual items, we were greatly increasing the longevity and quality of care provided. Each pack of AFRIpads guarantees a minimum of 36 months of service (following cleanliness requirements), which in turn allows us to extend our support to even more girls over time.

Dear Future's policy uses 24 months as a conservative approach, understanding that children in our communities have many challenges.

As Head of Operations at our partner nonprofit in East Uganda, Patience dedicates her time to teaching girls in the Mayuge region. After completing AFRIpads' "Trainer" course, she has become an expert in delivering essential education on the proper use and care of reusable pads with empathy and professionalism.

Patience addresses sensitive topics with confidence and care, creating a safe space where girls feel encouraged to engage in meaningful conversations and actively participate in the classes designed for them.

We are deeply grateful to have Patience as part of our hygienic pads team, representing the strong collaboration between Empathy Children Initiative and Dear Future.




### POSTCARDS WITH FRIENDS OUR PEN PAL ACTIVITY


Born out of a desire to connect our children around the world, our Pen Pal Program has been fostering relationships and inspiring dreams since its launch in 2022. It began when we noticed that students in Peru predominantly aspired to be police officers, sparking the idea of introducing them to the diverse aspirations of children from other regions. What started as a simple exchange has grown into a beautiful opportunity for connection, hope, and love.


In 2024, an incredible **690** postcards were exchanged between children in **Peru, Uganda, Jordan, and Zambia.** Some of the most touching messages came from exchanges between children in the orphanages we support and students from McKamy Middle School, Argyle High School, and Flower Mound High School in Lewisville ISD. #### OTHER ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Donation to
Lewisville ISD
Title 1 Schools

Dear Future was proud to donate \$1,500 to the Lewisville Independent School District in support of local Title 1 schools serving underprivileged children in our community. This contribution was intended to ease the challenges faced by teachers at the start of the school year by addressing critical resource gaps.

The donation was distributed across three schools: Mill Street Elementary, Lewisville Elementary, and Southridge Elementary, ensuring targeted support where it was most needed.

One of the rising NGOs in Uganda, Locus of Hope, has been making a significant impact under the leadership of Elli Gard Tumusiime, a local council member. Since early 2024, we have had the privilege of collaborating with this recently registered organization, which provides critical support to community members in need, including many children.

Dear Future -International has supported Locus of Hope in two key instances:

**1. Emergency Medical Transport:** We provided \$200 USD to transport a severely burnt child to Kampala for immediate treatment. The child received the necessary care and was safely returned to their village.

2. Child Rescue Mission: We contributed \$300 USD to rescue children allegedly held against their will in a remote school. This action was initiated after a local mother reported her daughter's abduction.

We are honored to have supported Locus of Hope in their mission and we will continue our assessment to find new opportunities to collaborate.



With their help, we provided 100 bowls and 100 cups for the school's cafeteria, ensuring the children have the essentials they need.




